Village of Sutherland, Nebraska
Official Municipal Election Ballot

PROPOSITION NO. 1:

Shall the Village of Sutherland, Nebraska establish an economic development program as described here (in this Proposition No. 1) by appropriating from local sources of revenue ½ of 1% of an estimated \$100,000.00 per year for fiscal years beginning 2022-2023 and continuing through fiscal year 2041-2042, the term of the sales tax set out in Proposition No. 2 (as submitted for approval at the same election)?

I. Description of the Economic Development Program:

The Economic Development Program presented by the Village Board is summarized as follows:

The Goals of the Sutherland Economic Development Program are to create jobs and generate employment opportunities; to expand labor markets of Sutherland and Lincoln County; to attract new capital investment to the community; to broaden the tax-base; to retain jobs; to assist existing businesses to be more competitive and profitable; and to provide economic diversification to ensure economic stability and vitality for the community of Sutherland and the surrounding area.

II. Duration of the Program: The length of time that the Program shall be in existence will be twenty (20) years.

II. Years for Collection of Funds: Collection of funds for the Program shall be on all taxable sales beginning on October 1, 2022 and shall end on September 30, 2041 (20 years).

III. Source of Funds: The source shall be ½ of the 1% Village and Sales and Use Tax provided in Proposition No. 2 (as submitted at the same election as this Proposition No. 1).

IV. Total Amount to be collected: The total amount to be collected is estimated to be \$100,000 per year in fiscal years 2022-2023 through 2041-2042, with the revenue being allocated to the Economic Development Program as set forth in Proposition No. 2 (as submitted at the same election as this Proposition No. 1), for a total aggregate estimated amount of \$2,000,000 (more or less depending upon actual collections from the sales and use tax).

V. The Village shall seek additional funds from other sources beyond those derived from local sources of revenue.

Voters voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words “YES (for the economic development program)” following said proposition and voters voting against said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the “NO (against the economic development program)” following said proposition.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

“Shall the Village of Sutherland, Nebraska impose a sales and use tax in the amount of one percent (1%) upon transactions with the Village on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose such tax pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967, as amended; which such sales tax shall be used for public infrastructure purposes which may include, but not be limited to, public highways and bridges and municipal roads, streets, bridges, and sidewalks; solid waste management facilities; wastewater, storm water, and water treatment works and systems, water distribution facilities, and water resources projects, including, but not limited to, pumping stations, transmission lines, and mains and their appurtenances; hazardous waste disposal systems; resource recovery systems; airports; port facilities; buildings and capital equipment used in the operation of municipal government; convention and tourism facilities; redevelopment projects as defined in Section 18-2103, R.R.S. Neb. et seq.; mass transit and other transportation systems, including parking facilities; and equipment necessary for the provision of municipal services and up to one-half of the one-percent (1%) collected tax to be used to pay for the Sutherland Economic Development Program (if approved by the Voters in Proposition No. 1).

If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of such tax, then the governing body of the Village of Sutherland shall be empowered as provided by Section 77-27,142, R.R.S. If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such tax, then the governing body of the incorporated municipality shall not impose such tax.

Voters voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "YES (for such sales and use tax)" following said proposition and voters voting against said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the "NO (against such sales and use tax)" following said proposition.

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Notwithstanding Propositions Nos. 1 and 2, shall the governing body of the Village of Sutherland, Nebraska, impose a sales and use tax of one-half percent (.5%) upon transactions with the Village on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose such tax pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967, as amended; which such sales tax shall be used for public infrastructure purposes which may include, but not be limited to, public highways and bridges and municipal roads, streets, bridges, and sidewalks; solid waste management facilities; wastewater, storm water, and water treatment works and systems, water distribution facilities, and water resources projects, including, but not limited to, pumping stations, transmission lines, and mains and their appurtenances; hazardous waste disposal systems; resource recovery systems; airports; port facilities; buildings and capital equipment used in the operation of municipal government; convention and tourism facilities; redevelopment projects as defined in Section 18-2103 R.R.S. Neb, et seq; mass transit and other transportation systems, including parking facilities; and equipment necessary for the provision of municipal services."
